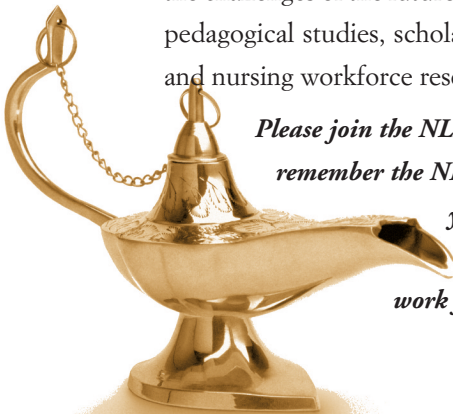

How can your legacy ensure a dynamic future for the National League for Nursing?

ESTATE PLANNING PROVIDES YOU WITH THE OPPORTUNITY to specify how your assets can help others. By directing the division and distribution of property, an estate plan can provide security for family members, minimize taxes and estate costs, and, through a bequest, create a lasting legacy at the National League for Nursing in your memory or the memory of another you may desire to designate.

There are three types of bequests: specific bequests, cash bequests, and residuary bequests.

The **Specific Bequest** gives a specific item or piece of property to the NLN Foundation for Nursing Education. These are fulfilled before cash and residuary bequests. .

A **Cash Bequest** states that the NLN Foundation for Nursing Education will receive a certain specified sum of money from your estate. These are fulfilled after specific but before residuary bequests.

The **Residuary Bequest** is made from the assets remaining in your estate after all specific and cash bequests, taxes, settlement costs, and debts are satisfied. Typically this is stated as a percentage, if you wish to divide the residue of your estate among different beneficiaries.

Gifts of **securities, real estate, equipment or other goods, or life insurance proceeds** are additional ways to remember the NLN.
